# Can I sell / cream cheese icing?

A 51-jurisdiction guide for cottage food producers, with the sanitation reasoning behind every yes, no, and conditional.

Cream cheese icing is restricted in most US jurisdictions — allowed under cottage food law in only 0 of 51 places, and even then usually with additional licensing. This report shows exactly where and how.

**ALLOWED**  
 Fits under standard cottage food law without extra permits.

**0**  
**CONDITIONAL**  
 Allowed with pH log, license, informed-consumer notice, or approved recipe.

**51**  
**NOT ALLOWED**  
 Requires a licensed commercial kitchen or is prohibited outright.

## WHY THE FOOD SAFETY RULES MATTER

**WHY IT'S ALLOWED (OR RESTRICTED)**  
 TCS = 'time/temperature control for safety'. These foods (dairy fillings, cream, custard, cream cheese frosting, moist meat products) support rapid pathogen growth between 41°F and 135°F. Any home kitchen without a commercial walk-in and documented cooling logs will fail a safety audit.

**SANITATION RISKS TO KNOW**  
 Salmonella and Listeria proliferation. Even a 2-hour delivery window in a warm car crosses the 'danger zone' threshold. This is why states restrict TCS to permitted commercial kitchens with temperature logs and health inspections.
