- ☐ **1. Menu** — Confirm each product under Connecticut cottage food rules (county cannot expand a state ban).
- ☐ **2. Pickup & zoning** — Home occupation and porch pickup cells above; HOA/lease may still block customer traffic.
- ☐ **3. Local tax / license** — Business license or sales tax certificate if your city/parish requires it (common even with no state food permit).
- ☐ **4. Training** — Food handler or state registration before market day.
- ☐ **5. Labels** — Disclaimer, allergens, ingredients, net quantity, producer info.
- ☐ **6. Call if unclear** — County health and planning for your exact address.

LABEL FIELDS TO INCLUDE

- ☐ Product name · producer name · address (or allowed alternative)
- ☐ Ingredients by weight · major allergens · net weight/quantity
- ☐ Connecticut home-kitchen disclaimer (see live label one-pager)

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED Yes (pre-licensure home inspection by CT DCP required) — Required before receiving annual cottage food license; DCP commissioner may also inspect at any time

HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT Yes (municipal zoning approval required before applying for CT DCP license) — Connecticut has NO county government — counties are geographic only. All zoning is administered by the 23 municipalities in Fairfield County (Bridgeport, Stamford, Greenwich, Norwalk, Danbury, etc.). Each municipality must be contacted individually. Operators must obtain written confirmation of local zoning compliance and keep it on file for DCP. Some Fairfield County municipalities have added 'Cottage Food Operator' as a listed Customary Home Occupation requiring a Home Occupation permit from the local Zoning Enforcement Officer.

RESEARCH NOTES

IMPORTANT: Connecticut counties have NO government. All zoning, permits, and business licensing are administered at the municipal (town/city) level. Each of the 23 municipalities in Fairfield County has its own zoning code. CT DCP requires written municipal zoning approval as a prerequisite for the state cottage food license. Annual \$50 license fee (max \$100 per statute). Home inspection required before first license. ServSafe Food Handler course required. \$50,000 annual sales cap. Private well requires annual water testing.

State context — Connecticut cottage food law

Fairfield County's rules sit on top of Connecticut's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

No — Indirect sales through retail stores, restaurants, or wholesale are not permitted; mail order and third-party delivery services are prohibited; only the producer or their designee may deliver within Connecticut.
