- ☐ **1. Menu** — Confirm each product under Indiana cottage food rules (county cannot expand a state ban).
- ☐ **2. Pickup & zoning** — Home occupation and porch pickup cells above; HOA/lease may still block customer traffic.
- ☐ **3. Local tax / license** — Business license or sales tax certificate if your city/parish requires it (common even with no state food permit).
- ☐ **4. Training** — Food handler or state registration before market day.
- ☐ **5. Labels** — Disclaimer, allergens, ingredients, net quantity, producer info.
- ☐ **6. Call if unclear** — County health and planning for your exact address.

LABEL FIELDS TO INCLUDE

- ☐ Product name · producer name · address (or allowed alternative)
- ☐ Ingredients by weight · major allergens · net weight/quantity
- ☐ Indiana home-kitchen disclaimer (see live label one-pager)

PET RESTRICTIONS	No explicit state restriction; good manufacturing practices apply.
WATER SUPPLY	Potable water supply required.
HANDWASHING	Adequate handwashing per food handler certification training.
FOOD STORAGE	Shelf-stable storage for non-PHF products; perishables not permitted.

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED	Upon-complaint — State law preempts local inspection requirements. ISDH may inspect upon consumer complaint.
HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT	Yes — Tippecanoe County requires a home occupation permit for home-based businesses in residential zones. Business registration also required. Indiana 2022 HEA 1149 expressly preempts local governments from adding licensing or inspection requirements for home-based vendors. Tippecanoe County Unified Zoning Ordinance §§5-5-1 through 5-5-4 (home occupations)

RESEARCH NOTES

Indiana 2022 HEA 1149 (IC 16-42-5.3) preempts local inspection/licensing requirements for home-based vendors but does not preempt home occupation zoning. Tippecanoe County FAQ confirms home occupation permit required (sections 5-5-1 to 5-5-4). County health department (TCHD) notes only West Lafayette farmers market allows home-based vendors. Food handler certification required by state law. No county-specific cottage food health rules beyond state baseline found.

State context — Indiana cottage food law

Tippecanoe County's rules sit on top of Indiana's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.
