- ☐ **1. Menu** — Confirm each product under Louisiana cottage food rules (county cannot expand a state ban).
- ☐ **2. Pickup & zoning** — Home occupation and porch pickup cells above; HOA/lease may still block customer traffic.
- ☐ **3. Local tax / license** — Business license or sales tax certificate if your city/parish requires it (common even with no state food permit).
- ☐ **4. Training** — Food handler or state registration before market day.
- ☐ **5. Labels** — Disclaimer, allergens, ingredients, net quantity, producer info.
- ☐ **6. Call if unclear** — County health and planning for your exact address.

LABEL FIELDS TO INCLUDE

- ☐ Product name · producer name · address (or allowed alternative)
- ☐ Ingredients by weight · major allergens · net weight/quantity
- ☐ Louisiana home-kitchen disclaimer (see live label one-pager)

Conditional (Louisiana allows low-risk foods prepared at home for sale under La. R.S. §40:4.9. No state permit required. Annual gross sales cap \$30,000. Allowed foods: baked goods, candies, cane syrup, dried mixes, honey, jams/jellies/preserves, pickles/acidified foods, sauces, syrups, spices. No animal muscle protein or fish protein. For breads/cakes/cookies/pies: no employees may assist; pets excluded from bakery area; refrigeration at 45°F or below; custard/cream-filled items must use pasteurized dairy. Orleans Parish/New Orleans requires local sales tax certificate and home occupation compliance.)

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED

Conditional — Louisiana allows low-risk foods prepared at home for sale under La. R.S. §40:4.9. No state permit required. Annual gross sales cap \$30,000. Allowed foods: baked goods, candies, cane syrup, dried mixes, honey, jams/jellies/preserves, pickles/acidified foods, sauces, syrups, spices. No animal muscle protein or fish protein. For breads/cakes/cookies/pies: no employees may assist; pets excluded from bakery area; refrigeration at 45°F or below; custard/cream-filled items must use pasteurized dairy. Orleans Parish/New Orleans requires local sales tax certificate and home occupation compliance.

SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN

PET RESTRICTIONS

Pets excluded from bakery area during production of breads, cakes, cookies, and pies.

WATER SUPPLY

No specific state requirement.

HANDWASHING

Standard food safety practices required.

FOOD STORAGE

Perishable ingredients refrigerated at 45°F or below. Non-TCS finished products.

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED

No — No routine inspection required under state cottage food statute.

Conditional — City of New Orleans has home occupation provisions and requires compliance with New Orleans City Code/zoning for home-based businesses. Orleans Parish also requires local sales tax certificate from the parish sales tax collector before selling. Contact: nola.gov.

La. R.S. §40:4.9 (state cottage food law); Orleans Parish/New Orleans City Code re: home occupations.

RESEARCH NOTES

Louisiana cottage food statute confirmed from state baseline. Orleans Parish follows state baseline. New Orleans is a parish-city consolidated government. Sales tax certificate from Orleans Parish required before any sales. No state permit required. \$30,000 cap (raised from \$20,000 in 2022). No employees for baked goods production. Confidence medium: state law high-confidence; New Orleans-specific home occupation code not directly researched.

State context — Louisiana cottage food law

Orleans Parish's rules sit on top of Louisiana's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

Limited (see notes) — Most low-risk foods may be sold indirectly (to restaurants, retail stores), but breads, cakes, cookies, and pies specifically may NOT be sold to any retail business or individual for resale — they are direct-to-consumer only.
