- ☐ **1. Menu** — Confirm each product under New Jersey cottage food rules (county cannot expand a state ban).
- ☐ **2. Pickup & zoning** — Home occupation and porch pickup cells above; HOA/lease may still block customer traffic.
- ☐ **3. Local tax / license** — Business license or sales tax certificate if your city/parish requires it (common even with no state food permit).
- ☐ **4. Training** — Food handler or state registration before market day.
- ☐ **5. Labels** — Disclaimer, allergens, ingredients, net quantity, producer info.
- ☐ **6. Call if unclear** — County health and planning for your exact address.

LABEL FIELDS TO INCLUDE

- ☐ Product name · producer name · address (or allowed alternative)
- ☐ Ingredients by weight · major allergens · net weight/quantity
- ☐ New Jersey home-kitchen disclaimer (see live label one-pager)

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?

Conditional (New Jersey cottage food program is restrictive. Requirements include: (1) local zoning board approval confirming residential use is permitted; (2) Food Protection Manager Certification (CFPM-level); (3) proof of water potability (well water test or utility bill); (4) \$100 permit fee valid for 2 years. Application review takes 12-16 weeks. Annual sales cap \$50,000. Allowed: non-TCS foods including baked goods, candy, dried goods, jams/jellies, nut butters, granola, honey, nuts, vinegar, mustard, and other non-TCS foods upon written application.)

Home kitchen rules

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED

Conditional — New Jersey cottage food program is restrictive. Requirements include: (1) local zoning board approval confirming residential use is permitted; (2) Food Protection Manager Certification (CFPM-level); (3) proof of water potability (well water test or utility bill); (4) \$100 permit fee valid for 2 years. SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN

PET RESTRICTIONS

Pets must be excluded from food preparation areas per NJ cottage food permit requirements.

WATER SUPPLY

Proof of water potability required: well water test or utility bill. Private well water testing required.

HANDWASHING

Adequate handwashing required per NJ cottage food permit standards.

FOOD STORAGE

Non-TCS foods only. No wholesale sales. Annual gross sales may not exceed \$50,000.

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED

No — Home kitchens not routinely inspected; health authority may enter if there is a complaint or suspected foodborne illness.

HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT

Yes — New Jersey requires local zoning board approval confirming residential use is permitted as part of the cottage food permit application. Cumberland County municipalities must provide this approval. This is a unique NJ requirement for cottage food operations specifically.

Relevant county code

Cumberland County municipal zoning ordinances; N.J.A.C. 8:24-11

RESEARCH NOTES

Pattern county. State baseline governs. New Jersey was one of the last states to legalize cottage food (2021). Restrictive requirements include CFPM-level certification, 12-16 week application review, local zoning board approval required. No Cumberland County-specific cottage food code identified.

State context — New Jersey cottage food law

Cumberland County's rules sit on top of New Jersey's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

INDIRECT SALES

No — Cottage food products may only be delivered or relinquished at: the operator's home (not for onsite consumption), the consumer's NJ home, a NJ farmers market or other permitted NJ location. Products cannot be sold to wholesale establishments, retail food establishments, or shipped out of state. Online and phone order-taking is allowed as an ancillary activity, but physical delivery must occur in New Jersey person-to-person or at permitted locations. Charitable bake sales remain exempt under separate provisions.
