BEFORE YOU SELL FROM THIS ADDRESS

- ☐ **1. Menu** — Confirm each product under North Carolina cottage food rules (county cannot expand a state ban).
- ☐ **2. Pickup & zoning** — Home occupation and porch pickup cells above; HOA/lease may still block customer traffic.
- ☐ **3. Local tax / license** — Business license or sales tax certificate if your city/parish requires it (common even with no state food permit).
- ☐ **4. Training** — Food handler or state registration before market day.
- ☐ **5. Labels** — Disclaimer, allergens, ingredients, net quantity, producer info.
- ☐ **6. Call if unclear** — County health and planning for your exact address.

LABEL FIELDS TO INCLUDE

- ☐ Product name · producer name · address (or allowed alternative)
- ☐ Ingredients by weight · major allergens · net weight/quantity
- ☐ North Carolina home-kitchen disclaimer (see live label one-pager)

QUICK VIEW FOR BAKERS IN THIS COUNTY

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?

Yes (North Carolina requires a home kitchen inspection by NCDA&CS before any sales. Pets (including indoor pets) disqualify the applicant entirely. Only shelf-stable, non-refrigerated products allowed. Must use public water or pass coliform/E. coli well water test. Applicant must contact local planning/zoning department to verify home-based food business is permitted.)

SEPARATE KITCHEN REQUIRED?

PETS ALLOWED?

Any pets in the home at any time disqualify the applicant from operating a home-based food business under NC Home Processor program. This is strictly enforced.

HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT?

Conditional (NCDA&CS home processor application (Step 4) explicitly requires checking with local/county planning department to verify permission to operate a food business from the home. Lincoln County Planning Department should be consulted. HOA rules should also be checked.)

ON-SITE / PORCH PICKUP?

Conditional

INSPECTION REQUIRED?

Yes (Annual inspection by NCDA&CS Food Regulatory Specialist required. Initial inspection arranged 8-12 weeks after application. Subsequent annual inspections required to maintain home processor status. A 'Notice of Inspection' is provided (not a permit). Major violations may disqualify the operation.)

Home kitchen rules

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED

Yes — North Carolina requires a home kitchen inspection by NCDA&CS before any sales. Pets (including indoor pets) disqualify the applicant entirely. Only shelf-stable, non-refrigerated products allowed. Must use public water or pass coliform/E. coli well water test. Applicant must contact local planning/zoning department to verify home-based food business is permitted.

SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN

PET RESTRICTIONS

Any pets in the home at any time disqualify the applicant from operating a home-based food business under NC Home Processor program. This is strictly enforced.

WATER SUPPLY

Public water: attach current water bill. Private well: must be tested for coliform and E. coli within one year of application; test must be by a certified agency (not store-bought kit).

HANDWASHING

Kitchen must pass NCDA&CS inspection for cleanliness, suitable materials, and absence of pest activity. Standard food manufacturing GMP handwashing requirements apply.

FOOD STORAGE

Storage plan for supplies, equipment, and finished product must be provided with application. Areas where materials, ingredients, and equipment are stored are also inspected.

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED	Yes — Annual inspection by NCDA&CS Food Regulatory Specialist required. Initial inspection arranged 8-12 weeks after application. Subsequent annual inspections required to maintain home processor status. A 'Notice of Inspection' is provided (not a permit). Major violations may disqualify the operation.

MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	Not specified in state rules; must be identified in the business plan submitted with application.

Relevant county code

No Lincoln County-specific cottage food ordinance identified. State 02 NCAC 9C.0307 governs. Lincoln County Planning should be consulted per NCDA&CS requirements.

RESEARCH NOTES

North Carolina's home processor program is notable for its annual kitchen inspection requirement and absolute pet prohibition. The NCDA&CS application form confirms that contacting local zoning/planning is a required step before applying. Lincoln County (seat: Lincolnton) has no county-specific cottage food rules identified. Contact NCDA&CS at (984) 236-4820 or homeprocessing@ncagr.gov for applications. Confidence is medium: state law confirmed from official NCDA&CS sources; Lincoln County-specific zoning not verified.

State context — North Carolina cottage food law

Lincoln County's rules sit on top of North Carolina's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

INDIRECT SALES Yes — Home processors may sell to retail stores, restaurants, and directly to consumers. Sales at farmers markets are permitted. Labels are required for wholesale and packaged self-service retail; direct hand-to-consumer sales (e.g., from home or at events) may be exempt from affixed labels if ingredient info is available on request. NC requires annual home kitchen inspection, which is unusual among no-cap states.
