BEFORE YOU SELL FROM THIS ADDRESS

- ☐ **1. Menu** — Confirm each product under North Carolina cottage food rules (county cannot expand a state ban).
- ☐ **2. Pickup & zoning** — Home occupation and porch pickup cells above; HOA/lease may still block customer traffic.
- ☐ **3. Local tax / license** — Business license or sales tax certificate if your city/parish requires it (common even with no state food permit).
- ☐ **4. Training** — Food handler or state registration before market day.
- ☐ **5. Labels** — Disclaimer, allergens, ingredients, net quantity, producer info.
- ☐ **6. Call if unclear** — County health and planning for your exact address.

LABEL FIELDS TO INCLUDE

- ☐ Product name · producer name · address (or allowed alternative)
- ☐ Ingredients by weight · major allergens · net weight/quantity
- ☐ North Carolina home-kitchen disclaimer (see live label one-pager)

Annual renewal required.)

Home kitchen rules

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED	Conditional — North Carolina requires annual home kitchen inspection by NCDA&CS and registration (Home Processor permit). No sales cap. Allowed: shelf-stable non-refrigerated baked goods, jams, jellies, preserves, candies, dried mixes, spices, acidified foods (pickles, BBQ sauce). Pets in the home DISQUALIFY the applicant entirely. Annual renewal required.
SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN	No
PET RESTRICTIONS	Pets in the home DISQUALIFY the applicant from a Home Processor permit. No pets allowed in the residence where cottage food is produced.
WATER SUPPLY	No specific water testing requirement in standard state rules, though facility must meet GMP standards.
HANDWASHING	Adequate handwashing facility required per NCDA&CS Home Processor rules.
FOOD STORAGE	Shelf-stable, non-refrigerated products only. Products in compliant packaging required.

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED	Yes — Annual inspection by NCDA&CS inspector required before permit issuance and annually thereafter.
HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT	Conditional — Orange County and Chapel Hill may require home occupation permits under local zoning (UNC Chapel Hill is located here). Orange County has its own planning/zoning department. No county-specific cottage food overlay identified beyond state requirements.

MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	Not specified by state law; local zoning may apply.

RESEARCH NOTES

Verified-large county. NC Home Processor program requires annual inspection. Pet disqualification is an absolute rule. No Orange County-specific cottage food code identified beyond state requirements. County URL verified.

State context — North Carolina cottage food law

Orange County's rules sit on top of North Carolina's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

Yes — Home processors may sell to retail stores, restaurants, and directly to consumers. Sales at farmers markets are permitted. Labels are required for wholesale and packaged self-service retail; direct hand-to-consumer sales (e.g., from home or at events) may be exempt from affixed labels if ingredient info is available on request. NC requires annual home kitchen inspection, which is unusual among no-cap states.
