- ☐ **1. Menu** — Confirm each product under South Carolina cottage food rules (county cannot expand a state ban).
- ☐ **2. Pickup & zoning** — Home occupation and porch pickup cells above; HOA/lease may still block customer traffic.
- ☐ **3. Local tax / license** — Business license or sales tax certificate if your city/parish requires it (common even with no state food permit).
- ☐ **4. Training** — Food handler or state registration before market day.
- ☐ **5. Labels** — Disclaimer, allergens, ingredients, net quantity, producer info.
- ☐ **6. Call if unclear** — County health and planning for your exact address.

LABEL FIELDS TO INCLUDE

- ☐ Product name · producer name · address (or allowed alternative)
- ☐ Ingredients by weight · major allergens · net weight/quantity
- ☐ South Carolina home-kitchen disclaimer (see live label one-pager)

Yes (South Carolina cottage food law (S.C. Code §44-1-145) allows non-PHF foods produced in primary domestic residence without registration, permit, or inspection. Allowed: baked goods, candy, jams, jellies, and other shelf-stable non-PHF foods. 2022 amendment (Act No. 208) expanded to allow retail store and grocery store sales, online/mail order sales. No sales cap. Label must indicate produced in unlicensed home kitchen. Potentially hazardous foods (requiring refrigeration for safety, pH above 5.6 or acidified above 4.6) prohibited unless product assessment conducted.)

S.C. Code §44-1-145 (state cottage food); Richland County Zoning Ordinance (home occupation provisions).

RESEARCH NOTES

South Carolina cottage food statute (S.C. Code §44-1-145) confirmed from state baseline. 2022 amendment significantly expanded allowed sales channels. No registration or permit required. Richland County (including Columbia) follows state baseline; no county-specific overrides found. Richland County food safety oversight transferred to SC Department of Agriculture effective July 1, 2024 (from DHEC). Confidence medium: state law high-confidence; Richland County local zoning rules not specifically researched.

State context — South Carolina cottage food law

Richland County's rules sit on top of South Carolina's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

Yes — Since the 2022 amendment, home-based food operations may sell to retail stores and grocery stores in addition to direct-to-consumer sales including online and mail order. Retail stores that sell home-based food products must post clearly visible signage indicating the products are not subject to commercial food regulations.
