## Executive summary

This report covers the Ohio cottage food framework — the state statute, the regulatory body administering it, what producers can and cannot sell, and county-level rules layered on top of state law for the 88 Ohio counties included in this dataset.

yes — Labeled cottage food products may be sold to or used by retail food establishments and food service operations licensed under Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3717. This enables indirect/wholesale sales within Ohio. Products may not be sold outside the state of Ohio.

### RESEARCH NOTES

The input statute\_url pointed to O.R.C. §3715.01 (general definitions), which does contain the definition of 'cottage food production operation' at subsection (A)(19), but the operative restrictions and requirements are in §3715.023, §3715.025, and Ohio Admin. Code Chapter 901:3-20. The ODA cottage foods page returned HTTP 404; the ohio.gov codes pages were used. Ohio has no sales cap and no registration requirement, but has a specific approved product list. Products cannot be sold outside Ohio. Ohio has a distinct two-tier framework: cottage food operations (no registration) vs. Home Bakery (requires license and inspection).

### Allowed foods

Approved cottage food products (per Ohio Admin. Code 901:3-20-04) include non-potentially hazardous bakery products, candy (not dipped fresh fruit), flavored honey, fruit butters, granola/granola bars, maple sugar, popcorn and related products, unfilled baked donuts, waffle cones, pizzelles, dry cereal and nut snack mixes, roasted coffee beans, dry baking mixes in a jar, dry herbs, and spice mixes with commercially dried ingredients.

### Prohibited foods

Acidified foods, low-acid canned foods, and potentially hazardous foods are expressly prohibited. Cottage food products may not be sold outside Ohio, may not be packed using reduced oxygen packaging, and may not include fresh-fruit-dipped candies. Food items not expressly listed in the approved product list (OAC 901:3-20-04) are also prohibited.

### Labeling requirements

Labels must include: business name and address, product name, ingredients in descending order by weight, net weight and volume, and the statement 'This product is home produced.' in 10-point type. Labels must also comply with 21 CFR Part 101 federal labeling requirements (per OAC 901:3-20-02).

## Statutory text — verbatim excerpt

### Statute excerpt — verbatim

Section 3715.025 | Restrictions on cottage food production operation. (A) A cottage food production operation shall not process acidified foods, low acid canned foods, or potentially hazardous foods. (B) The director of agriculture shall adopt rules in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code specifying the food items a cottage food production operation may produce that are in addition to the food items identified by name in division (A)(19) of section 3715.01 of the Revised Code. The director shall not adopt rules that permit a cottage food production operation to produce any food that is a potentially hazardous food. Section 3715.023 | Labels for cottage food production operation, processor, or beekeeper. (A) A cottage food production operation...shall label each of their food products and include the following information on the label: (1) The name and address of the business; (2) The name of the food product; (3) The ingredients of the food product, in descending order of predominance by weight; (4) The net weight and volume of the food product; (5) In the case of a cottage food production operation, the following statement in ten-point type: 'This product is home produced.'

Cottage food producers should check local zoning regulations to ensure there is no restriction on home-based retail sales.

### RESEARCH NOTES

Franklin County follows state baseline. Ohio's cottage food list is quite specific (enumerated approved products, not a general non-PHF standard). Key restriction: home must have only one residential stove/oven. Ohio notably allows cottage food sales to grocery stores, farm markets, and restaurants within the state — broader than many states. Products must bear the 'This Product is Home Produced' statement in 10-point font. No Franklin County-specific cottage food ordinance found.
