This is what it takes to sell from a home kitchen in Norfolk County. Confirm each step with Planning, Health, and the license office before you sell.

What you need

Norfolk County, Massachusetts. File every Yes. Confirm every Check or Ask. Stay under the sales cap.

If you want a shop or a rented commercial kitchen, these rows do not apply.

HOW THIS PLACE WORKS

This is a city or town permit, not a county one. Massachusetts abolished county government in most of the state. A residential kitchen permit is issued by the city or town Board of Health (for example Cambridge, Lowell, or Newton), not by the county. This packet still includes the state cottage-food pages. Call the Board of Health for the city or town on your address.

Where to file

State

Massachusetts registration: Yes. Routine kitchen inspection: Yes. Massachusetts residential kitchens are treated as food establishments, so permitted operators may sell at any venue within the state including restaurants and retail stores, without the wholesale restriction that most cottage food laws impose. Mail order and catering are prohibited. Local boards of health administer permits and may impose additional restrictions.

Zoning / home occupation

Varies by city. Each of Norfolk County's 28 municipalities (Dedham, Quincy, Braintree, Brookline, Milton, Needham, Wellesley, etc.) has its own Board of Health and zoning code. Contact the specific city/town Board of Health for permit details. No county-level government with permit authority in Massachusetts.

Health

Yes. Initial kitchen inspection required. Subsequent inspections at Board of Health discretion.

Business license

Varies

Pickup / delivery

Sales from home, events, farmers markets, and retail stores permitted. Mail order prohibited. Catering prohibited.

If you rent a commissary kitchen

A residential kitchen permit is not a food-establishment commissary. Massachusetts residential kitchens are treated as food establishments by the city or town Board of Health. A rented commissary is a different food establishment at that board, not a home kitchen.
