Where to file

State

Minnesota registration: Yes. Routine kitchen inspection: No. Sales are limited to direct-to-consumer channels: community events, farmers markets, from the producer's home, online (in-state delivery by the producer personally or by mail/commercial delivery), and fundraising donations. Restaurants, retail stores, roadside stands, mail order wholesale, and catering are prohibited. All deliveries must be made by the producer personally unless shipped by mail or commercial delivery upon a prior online sale. Home-canned products in the pH/water-activity exemption category (Subd. 1(a)(2)) may not be sold outside of Minnesota.

Zoning / home occupation

Varies. Clay County is home to Moorhead (Fargo-Moorhead metro area). No specific Clay County cottage food home occupation permit identified beyond state registration. Contact Clay County Planning & Zoning or City of Moorhead for local zoning.

Health

No. No routine inspection; MDA may investigate complaints

Business license

Varies

Pickup / delivery

Direct sales only; no wholesale or retail sales. Farmers markets, events, home, and online within Minnesota. Home-canned goods for direct MN sales only.

If you rent a commissary kitchen

MDA licenses food; local health may license food service. Minnesota cottage foods is an exemption. A commissary typically needs an MDA food handler license and/or a local food-service license, depending on the kitchen.
