Where to file

State

Minnesota registration: Yes. Routine kitchen inspection: No. Sales are limited to direct-to-consumer channels: community events, farmers markets, from the producer's home, online (in-state delivery by the producer personally or by mail/commercial delivery), and fundraising donations. Restaurants, retail stores, roadside stands, mail order wholesale, and catering are prohibited. All deliveries must be made by the producer personally unless shipped by mail or commercial delivery upon a prior online sale. Home-canned products in the pH/water-activity exemption category (Subd. 1(a)(2)) may not be sold outside of Minnesota.

Zoning / home occupation

Varies. No county-specific cottage food permit identified. Lac qui Parle County is a western Minnesota county on the South Dakota border with county seat Madison, located along Lac qui Parle Lake and the Minnesota River. Local townships may have home occupation zoning standards. Operators should contact Lac qui Parle County planning or their local township.

Health

No. Complaint-based investigation only.

Business license

Pickup / delivery

Direct sales from home, farmers markets, community events, and internet sales permitted. Canned goods may not be sold across state lines.

If you rent a commissary kitchen

MDA licenses food; local health may license food service. Minnesota cottage foods is an exemption. A commissary typically needs an MDA food handler license and/or a local food-service license, depending on the kitchen.
