Where to file

State

Montana registration: Yes. Routine kitchen inspection: Upon-complaint. Consignment sales at retail food establishments or through wholesale establishments are explicitly prohibited under §50-50-116(3). The Montana Local Food Choice Act also requires direct producer-to-informed-end-consumer transactions only; retail locations require a wholesale food license.

Zoning / home occupation

Varies. Richland County is an oil and agriculture county in eastern Montana (Sidney near the ND border). No formal county-level home occupation ordinances found specific to cottage food. The 2021 Montana Local Food Choice Act preempts local restrictions on homemade food sales. Cottage food registration (\$40 one-time fee) administered through local Environmental Health office.

Health

Upon-complaint. Consumer complaint or illness investigation only

Business license

Varies

Pickup / delivery

Face-to-face transaction required. Online advertising allowed but actual sale must be in-person. No third-party delivery services. Producer may deliver directly to purchaser.

If you rent a commissary kitchen

DPHHS / local health license retail food. Montana cottage food and the Local Food Choice Act are home paths. A commissary is a retail food establishment licensed by the local health department.
