What you need

Columbus County, North Carolina. File every Yes. Confirm every Check or Ask. Stay under the sales cap.

Where to file

State

North Carolina registration: Yes. Routine kitchen inspection: Yes. Home processors may sell to retail stores, restaurants, and directly to consumers. Sales at farmers markets are permitted. Labels are required for wholesale and packaged self-service retail; direct hand-to-consumer sales (e.g., from home or at events) may be exempt from affixed labels if ingredient info is available on request. NC requires annual home kitchen inspection, which is unusual among no-cap states.

Zoning / home occupation

Conditional. Applicants must verify with Columbus County planning department that operating a food business is permitted at the property. County-level permit requirements vary.

Health

Yes. Initial inspection required before production. NCDA&CS Food Regulatory Specialist contacts applicant within 2 weeks of application. Annual re-inspection applies.

Business license

Varies

Pickup / delivery

Products may be sold directly to consumers at retail stores, restaurants, and farmers markets, or via direct-to-consumer delivery. No explicit state-level delivery restrictions.

If you rent a commissary kitchen

NCDA or the local health department, depending on the food. North Carolina home processors register with NCDA. A commissary used as a food service kitchen is typically permitted by the local health department; a food manufacturing plant is NCDA. Ask the kitchen which license they operate under.
