## Where to file

### State

North Carolina registration: Yes. Routine kitchen inspection: Yes. Home processors may sell to retail stores, restaurants, and directly to consumers. Sales at farmers markets are permitted. Labels are required for wholesale and packaged self-service retail; direct hand-to-consumer sales (e.g., from home or at events) may be exempt from affixed labels if ingredient info is available on request. NC requires annual home kitchen inspection, which is unusual among no-cap states.

### Zoning / home occupation

Varies. NC state program requires checking with local county planning/zoning department before starting. Greene County is a small rural agricultural county in eastern NC. Zoning ordinance governs unincorporated areas; Town of Snow Hill may have additional requirements. No Greene County-specific cottage food ordinances found via research.

### Health

Yes. Annual inspection by NCDA&CS Division of Food and Drug Protection required before registration is issued and annually thereafter.

### Business license

Varies

### Pickup / delivery

Direct sales permitted at home, farmers markets, roadside stands, online, restaurants, and retail stores within North Carolina.

### If you rent a commissary kitchen

**NCDA or the local health department, depending on the food.** North Carolina home processors register with NCDA. A commissary used as a food service kitchen is typically permitted by the local health department; a food manufacturing plant is NCDA. Ask the kitchen which license they operate under.
