Orange County, North Carolina. File every Yes. Confirm every Check or Ask. Stay under the sales cap.

Where to file

State

North Carolina registration: Yes. Routine kitchen inspection: Yes. Home processors may sell to retail stores, restaurants, and directly to consumers. Sales at farmers markets are permitted. Labels are required for wholesale and packaged self-service retail; direct hand-to-consumer sales (e.g., from home or at events) may be exempt from affixed labels if ingredient info is available on request. NC requires annual home kitchen inspection, which is unusual among no-cap states.

Zoning / home occupation

Conditional. Orange County and Chapel Hill may require home occupation permits under local zoning (UNC Chapel Hill is located here). Orange County has its own planning/zoning department. No county-specific cottage food overlay identified beyond state requirements.

Health

Yes. Annual inspection by NCDA&CS inspector required before permit issuance and annually thereafter.

Business license

Varies

Pickup / delivery

Direct sales and indirect sales allowed (no sales cap). Permitted venues: farm, farm stand, farmers market, other direct-to-consumer and some retail channels.

If you rent a commissary kitchen

NCDA or the local health department, depending on the food. North Carolina home processors register with NCDA. A commissary used as a food service kitchen is typically permitted by the local health department; a food manufacturing plant is NCDA. Ask the kitchen which license they operate under.
