Where to file

State

South Dakota registration: No. Routine kitchen inspection: No. The statute does not restrict sales to direct-to-consumer channels only. Items are subject to sales tax. Local governments (counties, townships, municipalities) may not pass ordinances restricting, prohibiting, or imposing licensure on homemade food item sales under SDCL §34-18-1 definitions.

Varies. Tripp County is a rural county. No county-specific home occupation permit requirement for cottage food identified. Operators should verify with Tripp County offices in Winner.

If you rent a commissary kitchen

DOH licenses food service. South Dakota cottage food is a home path. A commissary is a food service establishment licensed by the Department of Health.
