Where to file

State

West Virginia registration: Depends. Routine kitchen inspection: Upon-complaint. Cottage food must be sold directly to consumers. The new Article 40 (effective June 12, 2026) establishes that potentially hazardous cottage food vendors need a statewide permit but nonpotentially hazardous food sellers are fully exempt from permit and inspection. Local health departments may invoke cessation of production only if an imminent health hazard exists, in consultation with the Department of Agriculture. The input batch cited §16-7-1 (a general adulteration statute), but the operative cottage food framework is now Article 40 (§19-40-1 through §19-40-6), signed March 27, 2026.

Zoning / home occupation

No. Webster County has no county-level zoning ordinance and does not require a home occupation permit for cottage food operations. State registration/permit required only for potentially hazardous foods through WV Dept. of Agriculture.

Health

Upon-complaint. No routine inspection for nonpotentially hazardous foods. Potentially hazardous foods require Dept. of Agriculture permit; complaint-based follow-up.

Business license

No

Pickup / delivery

Direct sales only within West Virginia. Home pickup, farmers markets, roadside stands, and events permitted. No interstate sales.

If you rent a commissary kitchen

A commissary is a food establishment, not cottage food. West Virginia cottage food is a home path. A commissary is a food establishment permitted by the local health department.
