## West Virginia labeling notes

**Statute:** W. Va. Code §19-40-1 through §19-40-6 (Article 40, Cottage Foods, enacted 2026); §19-35-6 (Nonpotentially hazardous foods at farmers markets)

**Font requirement:** (none specified)

**Required disclaimer:** This product was made in a non-commercial kitchen that may not be subject to inspection and may contain cross-contact allergens not included in the allergen statement.

**Summary:** Under the parallel §19-35-6 framework for nonpotentially hazardous foods, labels must include product content, sources, and potential allergens, plus the statement: 'This product was made in a non-commercial kitchen that may not be subject to inspection and may contain cross-contact allergens not included in the allergen statement.' For potentially hazardous cottage foods, labeling standards will be set by the Department of Agriculture by legislative rule.
