What official labels actually look like

Cottage food label content is usually established by state law or statewide agency rules. Local agencies may still register, permit, inspect, review labels, enforce zoning, or publish implementation examples unless state law preempts those roles.

Short answer: labels are usually governed at the state level

Most states establish the cottage food label fields and required disclosure in statute, regulation, or statewide agency guidance. Counties and cities often handle registration, permits, review, zoning, or enforcement. The allocation is jurisdiction-specific, and some states preempt local food-safety regulation.

County examples are valuable, with limits

Los Angeles County and Prince George's County publish useful implementation examples. Matagorda County also hosts a concrete visual, but its wording predates Texas's 2025 law. A county sample should never override a newer statewide requirement.

Use this as pattern research, not a copy deck

Open the linked current official page before production. Confirm the exact disclosure, type size, allergen format, address or registration-ID option, permit number, net quantity, and product-specific requirements for your jurisdiction.

State rule, local administration

The practical question is not simply state or county. It is which level writes the label rule, which level administers the operator, and whether state law limits local action.

California

CDPH publishes statewide requirements and says labels must comply with state and federal rules. Registration and Class B permitting happen through local environmental health agencies.

Identity	Product name and producer or business identity.
Ingredients	Ingredients in descending order by weight, including sub-ingredients where required.
Allergens	Plain-language major-allergen declaration or an accepted ingredient-list method.
Quantity	Net weight or net quantity in the jurisdiction's required format.
Traceability	Address, registration ID, permit number, county, date, or other local fields where required.
Disclosure	Home-kitchen, inspection, licensing, or cottage-food statement, often with exact wording.

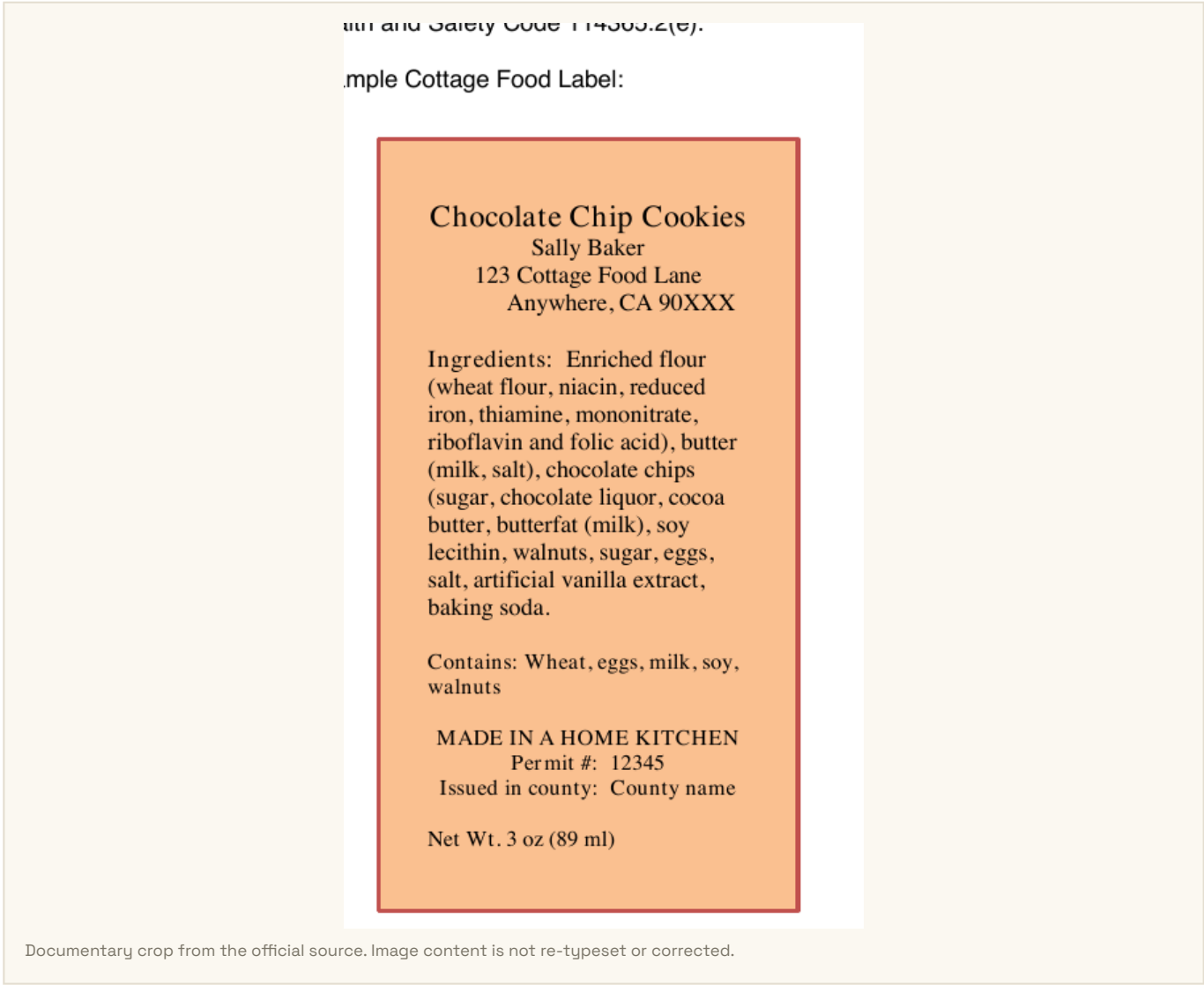

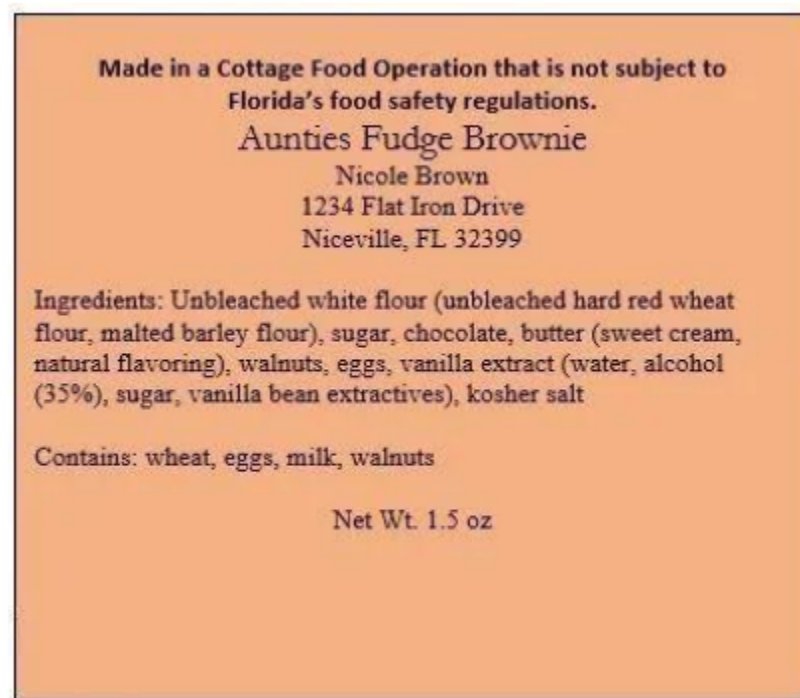


Figure 1. Example Cottage Food Label

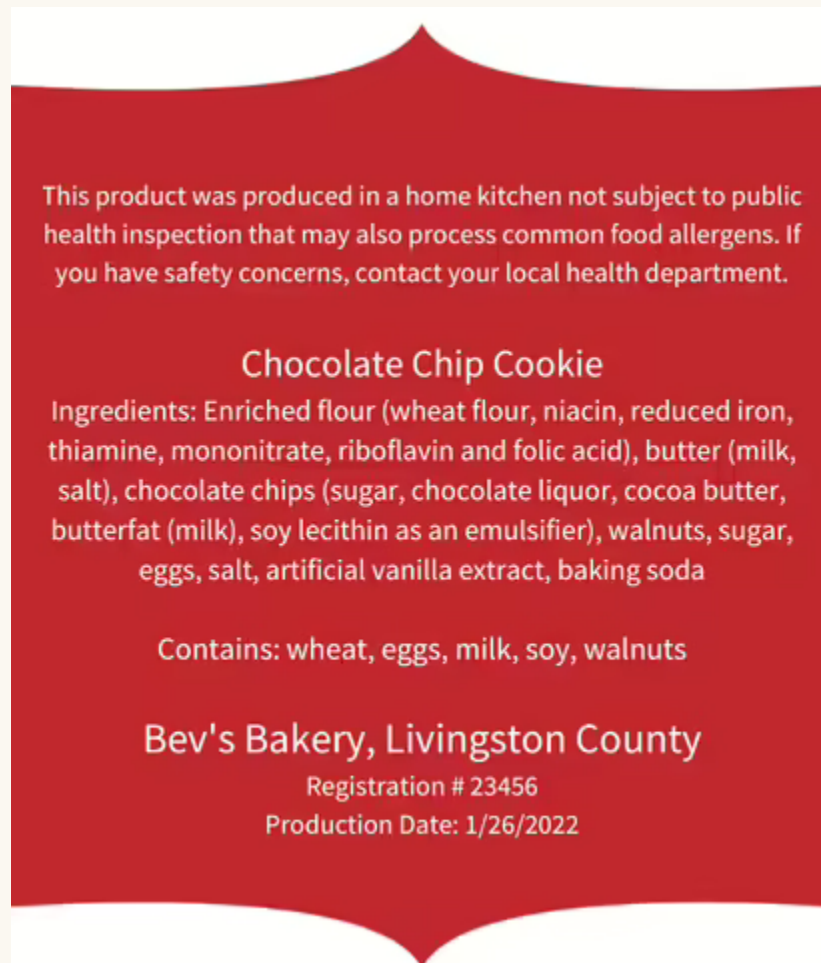

Labeling

Product labels are required to contain the following information: common/usual name of the product, ingredient list in predominance by weight, net quantity of contents, processor name, and full address. All allergens (eggs, milk, fish, shellfish, soybeans, peanuts, tree nuts, wheat, and sesame) must be clearly identified in the product ingredient statement.

Home processors should add a phrase like "Made at Home by XYZ," or "Made in the Home Kitchen of XYZ," or "Made in a Home Kitchen," to their label in addition to the label requirements outlined below. The font size for this phrase should be 1/16th inch or larger.

- Name & phone number of the producer.
- Physical address where the product was produced.
- Description of the homemade food product.

- Statement indicating the presence of any of the 9 most common allergens.

AND LEGIBLE PRINT STATING:

"This product was produced in a private residence that is exempt from government licensing and inspection."

On small packages or honey bears with very small flat spaces for labels, with PDPs under 5 square inches, the net weight can be in text no less than 1/16 inch



On half pint, pint, and quart jars, the PDP area would be more than 5 square inches but less than 25 square inches, requiring the net weight statement to be at least 1/8 inch in height.

How the examples were selected

The audit began with Crosodo's existing state-resource and state-labeling datasets. Each visual was then traced to an official state, county, state-library, or public-university source. A discrete image or a clearly formatted example had to be visible and readable enough to preserve as a documentary crop.

No visual located is a research result, not proof that an official example does not exist. New Jersey, for example, supplies a current written sample but no discrete visual was included in this edition. The report emphasizes source level and currency so old examples are not mistaken for current law.

Screenshots are reproduced for research, comparison, and public-source documentation. All agency names and source materials remain attributable to their respective publishers. Crosodo does not claim agency endorsement.
